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Our History






In 1864, the Fathers of the Catholic Mission took over a small building in Western District, in which they turned into a school with twenty boys on the roll. St. Aloysius was chosen as the Patron of the school, which since then has been known as St. Louis School. The Brothers of the Christian Schools succeeded the Fathers in the management of the school in 1875. In 1921, the Maryknoll Fathers took over and in 1927 it was handed over to the Salesian Fathers, who are now in charge.



In 1927, there were approximately 40 boys in the school, which was just one small habitable building. In order to develop the work in a way suited to the circumstances and needs, workshops were opened where the boys could learn a trade. By 1930 there were already 300 pupils on the roll of the Primary School. 1935 saw the opening of the Aberdeen Trade School to which the carpentry, shoe-making, tailoring and mechanical engineering departments were transferred; whereas the printing department continued to operate at St. Louis. A new building was erected in 1936 making it possible to open the middle school.





In 1939 the Junior Middle School produced its first graduates and in 1949 the English Section of the school was opened. It was in 1951 that we had our first Senior Middle class. In 1952, the new 20 classroom wing was opened. The Printing Department was transferred to the school comprised a Boarders' Section, a Chinese Primary and Middle School and an Anglo-Chinese Secondary School. We presented our first candidates for the Hong Kong School Certificate Examination in 1953. In the following year, our first Middle School graduates sat for the public examination. In July 1956, we held the last graduation ceremony of our Junior Middle School and in 1959, the Chinese Senior Middle School came to an end. Form Six classes were first operated in September 1962 and took part in the Matriculation Examination for the first time in 1964. Since then, the school adopted English as the Medium of Instruction.

St. Louis School is run by the Society of St. Francis de Sales, which is a worldwide order of Priests and Brothers that aims at educating the young. The educational emphasis is on the cultivation of moral values, religion and compassion so that pupils can develop in familial atmosphere of freedom and trust.

🕨 Reason

The ideal characteristics of a true educator are rationality and sensibility. By reasoning with students as to why certain rules are enforced, it will enable them to observe these rules willingly. This kind of reasoning is in alignment with "Freedom and Self-discipline" we advocate in school.







Religion

We provide students with an opportunity to come to terms with religion, placing stress on spiritual development as well as moral, intellectual, physical, communal and aesthetic growth. Through self-reflection, we encourage students to fend off temptations and develop noble characters without being over monitored.




Sung Laboratory Young Scientist Internship Award

Student Activity Association (SAA)

The Student Activity Association (SAA) established in 2006, formerly known as Independent Clubs Association (ICA) in 1973, aims at empowering clubs and houses and overseeing the conduct of all activities and inter-house competitions. Annually large-scale activities include Joint Club Exhibition, Christmas Celebration, Junior Training Programme (JTP), Joint School Leadership Training Camp (LTC), etc.



Houses

The five houses named Lily, Rose, Shamrock, Thistle and Tulip are a unique feature of our school. Each student is assigned to one of the houses. Senior form students take the initiative to be on the committee and organise activities for the juniors. They also encourage their house members to take part in various inter-house competitions. The house system provides opportunities to develop students' sense of sportsmanship, unity to their houses, and sense of belongings to the school.





Clubs and Societies

Run by a group of autonomous senior form students, activity clubs covering academic, sports and interests fields are open to all students in school with an aim to develop interests and provide another form of school exposure.


