ECONOMICS

(I) Aims

- 1. To provide students with basic economic knowledge and skills to understand better the world in which they live.
- 2. To develop students' ability to apply economic concepts and analysis to economic problems and issues.
- 3. To integrate school's major concerns into the syllabus. The school's major concerns for the coming 3 years 2019-2022 are as follows:
 - To boost the learning effectiveness and academic performance of students through systematically structured learning strategies.
 - To guide students developing their creative thinking within their learning.

SUBJECT / TEAM

- To cultivate students' personal growth in particular in value education especially on ideas related to fairness and justice.

(II) Situational Analysis

(a) Strengths

- > The subject nature is very interesting and lively. Social issues that can be discussed in the subject.
- Students in St. Louis are generally prepared for conducting mathematical analysis needed in Economics.

(b) Weakness

- > Language ability is relatively demanding for the careless and absent-minded students as the subject requires very careful minded thinking.
- Student diversity is great in elective classes that pose a challenge in lesson design.

(c) Opportunities

> The SBA in HKDSE has been postponed so that students and teachers can concentrate themselves on conventional learning and teaching.

(d) Threats

- > New assessment requirement is implemented by HKEAA which is not yet clear to be officially discussed.
- > It takes time to develop a new set of teaching material as the subject is adapting to a new panel head.
