Tens of thousands march in Hong Kong to protest proposed extradition law				
Pro-democracy organisers estimate as many 130,000 protesters (1)				
Tens of thousands of Hongkongers joined a protest this afternoon against the Government's proposed law to (2) fugitives from Hong Kong to the mainland, Taiwan and Macau.				
Several people carried yellow umbrellas, the symbol of the Occupy Central protests - also known as the Umbrella Movement - which partially (3) the city for three months in 2014.				
Organised by the pro-democracy Civil Human Rights Front, the "Withdraw Extradition Law Amendment" march began in East Point Road, Causeway Bay at about 4pm, and was (4) end outside the Legislative Council in Admiralty.				
The Civil Human Rights Front demanded the proposed law be dropped immediately, calling the <b>controversial</b> plan the "send to China rules", a phrase which in Cantonese sounds like the term for <b>funeral rites.</b>				
The Front claimed 130,000 people participated in the protest today, but police estimated the turnout at its <b>peak</b> was 22,800.				
Occupy leader Chu Yiu-ming, lawmaker Tanya Chan, and Cardinal Joseph Zen also attended. They were seen at a stall (5) by the Justice Defence Fund, raising <b>funds</b> for the legal <b>appeals</b> of the nine people arrested for their part in
