STUDY TOUR

(I) Aims

- 1. Students can learn to appreciate and respect the world through the exposure to different cultures and sightseeing
- 2. The visit or study in overseas schools provides opportunities for students to explore the possibility of further study overseas
- 3. Staying in foreign countries without families can enhance students' self-management skills and independence

(II) Situational Analysis

(a) Strengths

- Team members are enthusiastic and willing to devote themselves to the team
- Learning and exploring the cultures overseas are appealing to students
- Most of our students are financially capable and eager to visit places overseas
- Our school provides financial support to students in need

(b) Weakness

- Students tend to speak Cantonese instead of English when travelling overseas
- Most of our team members are green and it can be challenging for them to handle uncertainties during the tours
- Some students are self-centered and not sociable, leading to unexpected trouble
- Some students are occupied by other activities

(c) Opportunities

- More grants and resources are available for study tours
- Agents can provide tailor-made packages to fit our students' needs
- Study tours can prepare students for further studies
- Other teams and departments are initiating study tours and our team can provide useful information and logistics for them

(d) Threats

- Disciplinary issues, illness and injury of students may happen during the study tours
- Students are dependent and teachers have to be very attentive to avoid accidents

Tokyo Olympics 2020 raises the cost of Japan tours and safety has also become a concern

- (a) Homestay experience and studying in local schools in New Zealand allow students have a deep immersion in foreign culture and English learning environment
- (b) Students are more confident in speaking English after the New Zealand English Study Tour
- (c) Japan Environmental Science and Culture Study Tour are highly rated by the teachers and students
- (d) Electronic means are used to collect students information, reflections and photos to make the logistics more efficient
